What is ACSI? The Association of Christian Schools International is both an accreditation agency and a Christian school support organization. ACSI provides training, competitions, leadership development, legal and legislative information for both students and adults involved in Christian education.

This year's convention will be held in Sacramento on October 28-29. (Students will be out of school). The keynote speakers are Dr. John MacArthur and Dr. Brian Simmons, ACSI President. Music will be provided by Rescue.
